Summary of the year

- In 2024, we continued to expand our website and welcome well over 1200 visitors from around the world each day.
- Numbers of enquiries remained high, and we were delighted to be able to answer theological and pastoral enquiries, pray for visitors, and even help 73 people find a suitable church. Building on our ecumenical links, we have honed our offering, so that people can request a certain denomination or preference (ie. traditional, children's work etc.). If no preference is given, we offer a carefully picked selection of churches from across the denominational and cultural spectrum.
- Our largest audiences remain in the English-speaking countries of the US, UK and Austrailia, with Hong Kong now joining the top 10 for sending visitors.
- Our website is updated regularly, with new features and unique, balanced informative articles often added. New articles include, but are not limited to, Meditation, mindfulness and prayer, Why do Catholics honour the saints?, What is Pentecost? and opinion pieces such as Near death experiences, Miracles and healing today, and Life as a nun.
- Due to large numbers of enquiries from countries where Christians are persecuted, we've published a page full of helpful information, links and encouragements for those living in hostile contexts.
- With an upsurge in mental health diagnoses, we have created a dedicated feature page, full of articles giving helpful Christian perspectives and testimonies on the subject of mental health.
- 2024 sees our current patrons, the Revd and Right Hon Baroness Maeve Sherlock, and His Eminence Archbishop Angaelos of London (Coptic Orthodox), joined by Bishop Mike Royal (chair of Churches Together in England) and Dr Amy Orr-Ewing (theologian and author).
- In addition to our twice-weekly posts on Facebook and X, we have set up a presence on Bluesky and started posting and building a following there. We also attended and spoke at a number of events to promote our work and network with other Christian organisations.
- We've created a new audio feature for our website, where visitors can listen to (as well as read) selected articles. We will be increasing this offering over the coming year. Spotify users can now also hear those articles through the music platform.
- With extra resources, we would like to continue growing our audio offering, and our testimonies page. We also plan to create an interactive timeline of Jesus' life our most popular article.
